

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Christianity Revised!

The book of Galatians was written to a group of churches (Gal. 1:2) in the region of Galatia. Paul planted these congregations that were comprised of Jewish and Gentile members, which all seemed to have had the same problems, hence the relevance of the epistle to all of them. In his letter, Paul sought to address the problem of false teachings (Gal. 1:6-9). There were some Jewish Christians who were insisting that the Gentile brethren needed to keep the Law of Moses to be saved, in particular the law of circumcision (Gal. 6:15). These Jewish members wanted to present their own version of New Testament...a revised version.

Our culture glorifies one who is innovative, creative and entrepreneurial. These Judaizing members must have seen themselves in that light. However, while these are excellent qualities to possess, they must never be used to subvert or violate God's laws. This was a major downfall for Jeroboam. He was the first king of divided Israel. In 1 Kings 14:9, the prophet Ahijah clearly stated the sins of Jeroboam: "You have done more evil than all who lived before you. You have made for yourself other gods, idols made of metal; you have aroused my anger and turned your back on God." Jeroboam's sin was idolatry. He revised Israel's worship.

Having control over the northern part of the divided kingdom, Jeroboam ceased all pilgrimages to Jerusalem: "It is too much for you to go up to Jerusalem. Here are your gods, Israel, who brought you up out of Egypt.' One [golden calf] he set up in Bethel, and the other in Dan. And this thing became a sin; the people came to worship the one at Bethel and went as far as Dan to worship the other" (1 Kings 12:28–30). In addition to sacrificing to these two golden calves, Jeroboam "built shrines on high places and appointed priests from all sorts of people, even though they were not Levites" (1 Kings 12:31). What God had instituted for Israel was designed for them to focus on Him with the sacrifices, holy days and worship at Jerusalem. However, Jeroboam presented an amended version that was designed to bring him glory and comfort, and convenience for the people. He revised the place of worship from Jerusalem to the cities of Dan and Bethel. (cf. 2 Chron. 6:6).

Like Jeroboam and the Jewish members of the Galatian congregations, to this day, men continue on an unrelenting path to revise or change what God has handed down to us. Our God has made it explicitly clear that there should be no alteration of His word neither by adding nor by subtracting from it (Deut. 4:2; Prov. 30:6; Rev. 22:18-19), all of which will cost us our souls. Our quest, therefore, should not be to revise 1st century Christianity but to continue it by accepting God's word as it is. It is clear then, that God does not want a replica (that which looks similar but is not the same) but a continuation of New Testament worship. He will accept nothing more or nothing less!
