FOOD FOR THOUGHT

We All Make Mistakes, But..! - R. Webster

Everyone Makes Mistakes. This is in no way designed to condone, justify or ignore the wrongs or mistakes we have done. It is very tempting to pivot back on this statement in an attempt to rationalize our indiscretions. "Mistakes" here is used to represent our thoughts and actions that break the laws of God which amount to sin. 1 John 3:4 "Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness." "Everyone" here includes every person who knows the difference between right and wrong. Paul informs us that "all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" Rom. 3:23. However, the path to forgiving ourselves and others who have wronged us is enshrined in this profound admission. We have all heard the idiom "To err is human and to forgive is divine." Our failure to forgive others oftentimes is due to our refusal to accept the truth that all of us at different times in our lives have regretted some things said and done.

The fact that we all make mistakes does not exonerate us from owning up to our responsibility and even the consequences that follow. Job, in recognition of this fact, declared, "And if indeed I have erred, My error remains with me" (Job 19:4). God echoed through His prophet Ezekiel that "The soul who sins shall die. The son shall not bear the guilt of the father, nor the father bear the guilt of the son. The righteousness of the righteous shall be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon himself" (Ezekiel 18:20). We also have a responsibility to repentantly confess our transgressions to God. Unless that is done, we can never truly enjoy His divine blessing of forgiveness that we all so desperately need. 1 John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Lastly, we have a duty and responsibility to learn from our mistakes, and through prayer and a reliance on the assistance of the Holy Spirit, to pick up the pieces and rebuild our lives. William A. Ward said, "Failure should be our teacher, not our undertaker." The story is told of Thomas A. Edison's plant that was on fire. As he helplessly watched it burn, taking his costly experiments up in flames, he called his son Charles. "Come!" he said. "You'll never see anything like this again!" Then he called his wife. As the three stood gazing, Edison said, "There go all our mistakes. Now we can start over afresh." In two weeks, he started rebuilding the plant, and it was not long before he invented the phonograph!
